




# Artist Statement (Modified Contour)

Perspective drawing is a technique that is used to make 2D objects and things look 3D.




# Artist Statement

A still life is a work of art depicting mostly inanimate subject matter. Still life usually include food, flowers, and other inanimate objects.





# Still Life Artist Statement
